Dear Parents/ Carers,

Welcome back to another year at school! Here is a brief outline of what we will be doing in Class 3 this term.

Literacy: Our focus this term will be Goodnight Mister Tom and we will be focusing on writing character and setting descriptions, diary entries, letters of persuasion and working on our debating skills.

Maths: We have lots to get through this term! Before the October half-term, we are looking at place value, addition and subtraction. After the half term, we will be doing multiplication, division, statistics, perimeter, area and volume.

R.E: This term we are learning about God Incarnate and Islam.

History: This half term we are focusing on the Battle of Britain and The Home Front.

Geography: After the half-term in Geography we are studying maps of the local area and also how we find out about localities.

Science: We will be focusing on the habitats, lifecycles, evolution and inheritance of living things.

French: In French we are learning about the weather and the four seasons.

Art: In art we are taking part in an Armistice project which will be displayed in an exhibition at the Suffolk Punch Trust in November. We will be creating poppies and horses through different forms of art. This links to our work in Literacy and History.

P.E: P.E will be led by Miss Mee on a <u>Monday</u> afternoon. Please ensure your children have a P.E kit in school. Please also ensure all pieces of kit have your child's name on them and suitable clothing for wet/cold weather is provided. We will also be going swimming every Friday so please ensure your child has their swimming kit.

Children are welcome to continue bringing a pencil case containing a pencil, pen, ruler and a rubber. I would just like to remind you that pencil sharpeners are <u>not allowed.</u>

Homework will be issued weekly which will consist of a spelling test (which will be carried out on a Monday with new spellings issued every Monday) and a weekly times table test (which will also be carried out on a Monday). Please support and encourage your child to practice these at home. Additional English and Maths homework will also be issued on alternate weeks. Children are also expected to read five times a week, the reading record will need to be signed by a parent daily to show this.
